The Wetzel County Board of Education met in Regular Session on Monday, October 3, 2016, at Paden City High School in Paden City, WV at 6:30 p.m. Prior to the meeting, the Paden City High School band entertained the Board and audience with a selection of songs. The following members were present:

OPENING, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, AND INVOCATION:

This Regular Session of the Wetzel County Board of Education was called to order by the President of the Board, Mr. Warren L. Grace, Jr. Mr. Balcerek led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Mr. Blair gave the opening Invocation.

RECOGNITION:

Wetzel County Teacher of the Year - Edward T. Toman

Mr. Toman introduced Mrs. Belinda Baker, Special Education Teacher at Paden City High School, who was selected 2016 Wetzel County Teacher of the Year. Mr. Toman congratulated Mrs. Baker and presented her with a plaque from the State Department, and Mr. Grace presented her with a plaque from Wetzel County Schools. Mr. Toman also presented her with a Microsoft Surface Pro to assist in the classroom.

PRESENTATION:

<u>Presentation of Check to Paden City Public Library – Jeff Lancaster</u>

Mr. Lancaster presented a check in the amount of \$4,000.00 to Margaret Sine, President of the Paden City Public Library Board. The funds are a result of the Wetzel County Schools' 'Excess Levy', and Mr. Lancaster expressed his appreciation to Mrs. Sine for all they continue to do for the school system.

REPORTS:

<u>Introduction to A-F – Tammy H. Wells</u>

Mrs. Wells provided the Board and audience with a handout and explained the A-F grading scale public schools will be receiving in the next few weeks. Mrs. Wells discussed the descriptions of each letter grade, and stated that schools will only be graded on a bell curve for the first year. She went on to review the measures used to determine the grades, stating that 83% is based on student performance, which includes growth and proficiency. The other 17% is measured on non-performance items, such as attendance, graduation rates, and percentage of students in advanced placement courses and completers in CTE courses. Mrs. Wells explained that the accountability system is being implemented because of the *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA). She also said it was important to have an accountability system in order for the public to understand how schools are doing academically. Mr. Blair asked if the schools will be ranked with this new system, and Mrs. Wells said she would find that answer out and let them know.

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Annual Report of the Local School Improvement Council of Paden City High School – Jason P. Salva, Principal, and LSIC Chairs:

Mr. Salva welcomed everyone and recognized the Paden City High School LSIC members. He began by congratulating Band Director, Debra Price, and the band on winning Runner-up to Grand Championship this past Saturday at Vikingfest in Ripley, WV. Mr. Salva provided a powerpoint presentation and thanked the Board of Education, Mr. Jones, and Mr. Lancaster for all the upgrades to the school. Some of those included new tile in the hallway, new security windows with 3M film on the first floor and Commons area, new exterior doors, HD video security camera and TV's, and new digital marquee sign for the outside.

Mr. Salva reviewed the PCHS Mission Statement, along with the Core Beliefs for both the staff and the students. He briefly reviewed the 2015-2016 Strategic Plan Goals and what they did to achieve them. Mr. Cork Bowen, LSIC chair, provided the Board with a handout and Mr. Salva discussed the 2016-2017 Strategic Plan Goals as follows:

- 1. Increase data driven instruction by 80% as measured by increased student literacy and high performance writing in all content areas. This will be achieved by administering the ICA's and diagnostic tests.
- 2. Increase student achievement in mathematics on the WVGSA by 3% in grades 7-11. Teachers will use the interim pre and post test data to determine areas that need more instructional focus. They will also have PLC meetings and continue with the MDC training and math FALS. Mr. Salva also said they will visit schools with high math achievement.
- 3. Provide a safe and secure environment and promote a culture of high expectations and a shared mission for staff, students, parents, and community in order to meet or exceed all annual measureable objectives.

Mr. Salva went on to review the WVGSA scores for 2015-2016 in English/Language Arts and Mathematics, and provided a comparison with the scores from 2014-2015. He noted that mathematics is their weak area and said they are focusing on that this year. Mr. Salva went on to review their enrollment, attendance data, discipline data, and graduation rate. He said enrollment is down this year with 173 students. He proudly stated that their attendance rate was 95.30%, which was the best in the county. Their graduation rate for the 2015-2016 school year was 100%. Of the 31 students who graduated in May 2016, 28 of them are furthering their education, 1 enrolled in the Navy, and 2 went straight to work. Mr. Salva said they were 2nd in the state for FAFSA completion percentage, and he thanked Mr. Chad West for his hard work with this. Mr. West said the state goal is 60% completion rate, and Paden City High School has exceeded that goal the last two years, with 72% in 2015 and 81.3% in 2016. Mr. West also commended the teachers for promoting the FAFSA, and WVNCC for their assistance with the students and families.

Mr. Salva introduced senior student Wesley Smith. Mr. Smith is the first dual completer for Paden City High School in Business and Food Science & Nutrition. Wesley briefly discussed both programs and the Simulated Workplace in both concentrations. He plans to attend college and major in Business Management and then go on to Culinary school. His goal is to open his own restaurant. He stated that being a completer in both programs has been very helpful.

Mr. Salva introduced senior students Abby Means and Lexy Glover, representing the yearbook committee. Miss Glover distributed copies of the 2015-2016 yearbooks for the Board members to review. Miss Means talked about the yearbook class and stated it is a work-based learning class. She discussed the different jobs the students have for that class.

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Mr. Salva reviewed the LSIC Goals for 2016-2017 as follows:

- 1. Increase enrollment
- 2. Create monthly clubs
- 3. Increase educational opportunities

Mr. Salva introduced senior student Jake Pierce. Mr. Pierce demonstrated and discussed his bamboo canoe project he is working on in his art class. Mr. Pierce's canoe is made out of bamboo, paracord and twine, and he commended his art teacher, Mr. Kinnard, for his knowledge and assistance with this project. He further stated it would be good for the school to have additional art supplies and to have Mr. Kinnard fulltime. Mr. Salva also passed around pictures from their annual Matthew Barker Cardboard Boat Race Regatta they recently held. Mr. Blair suggested the Board assisting in additional funding for art supplies. Mr. Lancaster stated the schools have an art allocation per student and the Board recently gave a one-time increase of \$48,000 to the art program in the schools.

Mr. Salva reviewed the LSIC wish list for the 2016-2017 school year. These included a fulltime art teacher; ventilation for the art room, science rooms, home-economics room, and computer rack room; new art room furniture; renovate field house; new bell system; new stage flooring and microphone plugs on the stage; closed-in walkway from the main building into the multi-purpose building; and an additional custodian.

Annual Report of the Local School Improvement Council of Paden City Elementary School – Tammy D. Chambers, Principal, and LSIC Chairs:

Mrs. Chambers provided the Board with a handout and reviewed information and discussion from their first LSIC meeting. She introduced and recognized the LSIC and staff members present.

Mrs. Chambers reviewed the Smarter Balance results in Reading/Language Arts and Mathematics. She provided a graph which showed a comparison of the school with the county and state. She stated the focus on close read and comprehension contributed to their R/LA scores, and she noted that this year they are going to be focusing on understanding basic concept and procedures in mathematics. Mrs. Chambers reviewed the trend data results from the WV General Summative Assessment. She noted that math scores have dropped, but the R/LA scores increased. Mrs. Chambers went on to review the walkthrough data she collected for the 2015-2016 school year. She completed 88 walkthroughs, observing lesson plan information, universal high quality classroom practices, and school based engagement strategies.

Mrs. Chambers discussed the LSIC Annual Productive and Safe Schools Report. They had 13 in-school suspensions and 3 out-of-school suspensions during the 2015-2016 school year. She highlighted the list of activities the school has done to promote anti-bullying and prevent harassment. Mrs. Chambers also reviewed the discipline data report, which revealed an increase in office referrals. She said they are currently working on a 'quiet zone' to assist students first thing in the morning with things such as make up work and homework.

Mrs. Chambers expressed her appreciation for the changes and upgrades to the building. Some of those included the office being moved to the front of the building, electrical upgrades, guidance room separated from the nurse's office, new pre-k playground, and new carpet and tile. She thanked the Board and county office for the PBIS materials, new roof, color copy machine, new conference table and chairs. She also said they are in the process of getting a new digital sign and storage building.

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Mrs. Chambers discussed the wish list for Paden City Elementary School. Their main request is for a multi-purpose room, new gymnasium, or cafeteria. They have concerns in that they are limited as to when and what types of activities they can host with their current gymnasium. It is used for many things including breakfast, lunch, gym classes, assemblies, and picture day. Activities often conflict with gym class. She offered further ideas in reconstructing the building to allow for office space for the physical education teacher, storage space for equipment, band room, additional classrooms, and an elevator to allow handicapped accessibility. Additional wish list items included completing the fencing around the pre-K playground, hallway doors in the pre-k wing, and continued support for replenishing the items for the PBIS.

Mr. Elliott Kendle shared the LSIC goals from the 2015-2016 school year and stated they made progress on all goals. He said that at the beginning of this school year, the staff reviewed the data from the summative assessment and saw a need for improvement in mathematics in all grade levels. The goals for 2016-2017 are as follows:

- 1. Continue to increase data driven instruction to each individual.
- 2. Develop school wide math goal focused on concepts and procedures at each grade level.
 - 3. Provide family educational opportunities to increase parent involvement.

Mrs. Margaret Sine, former Principal, Mrs. Chambers and Mr. Kendle concluded the presentation with the opening of the 10-year time capsule. They exhibited the contents, which included numerous items such as books, newspapers, notes from teachers and students, class pictures, class lists, staff lists, and menu.
