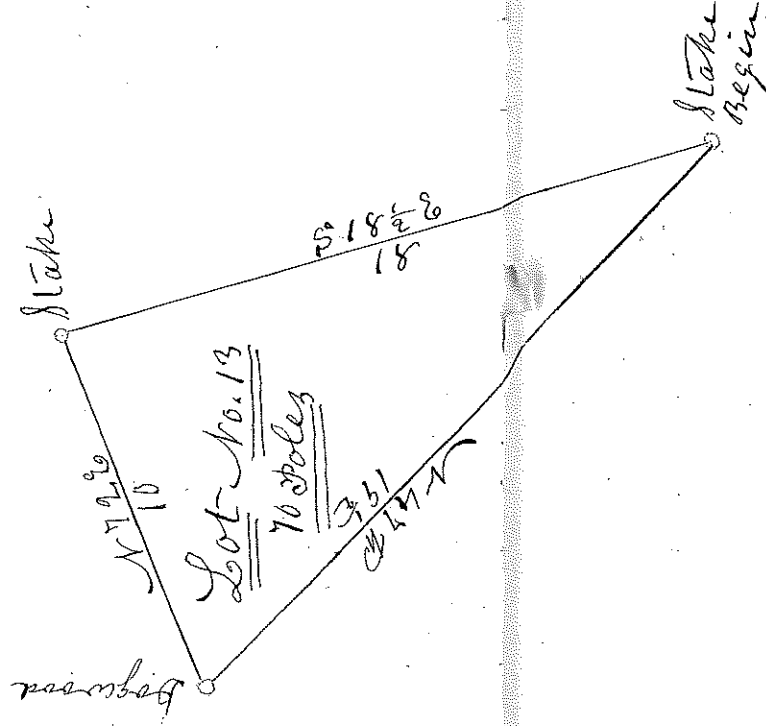

into between Henry F. Moore of the County
of Nitely and the State of West Virginia of
the first part - and Francis Gosar
James Newman, E. Moore & John Hurley
members of the Board of Education of Brocton
Township in the County and State aforesaid
of the second part - Witnesseth that for
and in consideration of the sum of one
Dollar to him paid, the said Henry F. Moore
agrees to convey by General Warranty Deed
to the parties of the second part and their
successors in office for ever, for school purposes
the parcel of land already located and surveyed
for that purpose ^{on his land} or any other parcel of land
of similar dimensions adjoining or close to
the place already mentioned which said Board
of Education shall approve of
